A WORD FROM OUR NEW PRES

From Model to Jigsaw and Back, by Dave Little.

A couple of weeks back at our Mead Road airstrip, I inadvertently converted my "ex Russell Gulliver" .46 Super Tigre " Honey Bun" into a 100 piece jigsaw.

The story goes like this, I was taxing for take off and John Ryan asked, "Do you mind if I come up and join you?" to which I replied, "Good as gold!" Next thing we were chasing each other around the sky in a semi dogfight fashion, having lots of fun and not all that high either. Then I took my eye off my model to see which way John was going to turn, and hullo, when I got back to my plane, I was heading to the ground upside down, like I'd been shot down, with too much sky above me to have any room to recover. There's a couple of lessons in there, or maybe three!

Here are some repair progress shots, it will fly again I think.



Some missing pieces still had to be "search and rescued" from the crash site, as a couple of missing items of wreckage had sprung some distance after impact. The search was successful.



One piece at a time had to be glued and set before adding the next piece, it looks a bit like open heart surgery with clamps pushing and pulling in all directions.



Expecting the fuselage to be perfectly aligned was of course a long shot once the glue had set. The steam heating treatment had to be done before the fuselage was totally joined up to give some flexibility required to align the fuselage in both rolling and yawing directions.



The tricky part was getting the tailplane section properly levelled, but it did work out successfully. Once the clamped up fore and aft sections had cooled off overnight the clamps were removed and everything remained lined up. So not too far to go now, a bit of sanding painting and buffing and repairing the starboard wing-tip, not a five minute job though, but fun in seeing it come together.

<u>Footnote</u>, on a different subject, following the outcome of the AGM, I am looking forward to the challenge of the position of Club President and working with not just the Committee members but also the wider financial members. We only have about a third of our membership that regularly come out and attend, you don't have to fly to enjoy the outing, come out for a picnic and observe what's going on, and I'm sure this would inspire the flying bug again. We are happy to help out getting pilots revitalised, even of it means a bit of dual instruction which we are well set up for.

Also I would like to see more young members being encouraged to give the hobby a try, there are so many attributes in this hobby that translate into developing skills and character building!










Another Arduino Project

The latest Arduino project has been a single channel encoder. Thanks to the Mode Zero group the software sketch is free to download. An old 36Mhz r/f module was at hand, so a pc board was knocked up with a buffer and it all worked first time. Several flights have now been made with a Mills 75 powered Simplex without missing a beat. The 75 has now been replaced with a Mills 1.3 and a much better rate of climb has been established.

The button gives standard single channel emulation and the centre off switch at the top emulates two channel reed operation on rudder.

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
